What is Dual Immersion?

Dual Immersion is a challenging and rigorous academic program that begins in kindergarten and continues through fifth grade. Spanish is the target language of instruction. Students learn in Spanish in K-1 grades and master the Spanish skills to add on the English language skills at third grade and beyond.

As the level of instruction in the DI program holds an added value of rigor, it prepares students for future participation in TCHS's International Baccalaureate Program and Diploma.
